Headteacher Comment:

It has been another productive half term at Larchwood which culminated in two successful parent consultation evenings this week. It is always so good to share how well the children are doing. I wanted to reflect on some of the many successes since September. The term started with the publication of our excellent Ofsted report which highlighted all the great things about the school. Sixty new Reception children started their journey with us and they have settled in brilliantly. I have lunch with them every Wednesday and each week I can see their progress, they are doing amazingly.

Learning has been happening at pace across the school and it is clear how well the children are doing. I am frequently in lessons watching what is happening and seeing children enjoying their learning. I am really pleased as well at how much better the reading numbers have been this term. This is especially true for Reception who have started off in the right way.

This half term break, the school will be a hive of activity for the two weeks as the building work continues at pace. The teams have been working evenings and weekends this half term, but the two weeks gives them a good block of time to get lots done. The 46 new fire doors should all be fitted, the new heating system is likely to come online and the electrical work will move to the Year 6 wing with new lights, wiring and ceilings being installed.

After the well-deserved break, our focus will continue to be to make sure children achieve their potential and are learning the best they can. Our attendance continues to be above average with many children still having 100% attendance. However there remains a few children who are missing too much school and I will be meeting with more of these parents once we return. One of the benefits about the two week half term is the fact that we can all benefit from cheaper holidays. Just a reminder that next year the extra week is the week before the normal half term, not after like it has been. Please check the dates here before booking holidays. In the meantime, enjoy the two week break and we will see you at 8:30am on Monday 11 November.

Breakfast Club and Afterschool Club

Just a reminder that after half term breakfast club and afterschool club spaces need to be booked and paid for in advance. The system has been 'live' all week and bookings have been coming in already. Bookings can be made on Parentpay and can be made up until 07.00 each day for breakfast club and up to 14.00 for afterschool club, the same time as it is now. There is still no cap on the number of children who can be booked in.

Half Term Holiday Club

As you will know from the letter that went out earlier in the term, we are really pleased to be able to offer a multi-sports holiday club for the second week of half term in November which will be run by Moores Coaching and held at St Martins School. Although this club is not run or organised by us, it is exclusively for children from the three Discovery Educational Trust (DET) primary schools. It runs from 08.30 until 15.30 every day and costs just £30 a day, or £120 for all 5 days. Bookings can still be made by clicking the link here.
