

Mr Bowsher's Headteacher Comment:

Welcome back and a slightly belated Happy New Year. I hope everyone had a good break. It has been great to be back and see everyone looking so smart and ready to learn this week.

Staff were all back in school on Friday 3 January and the time was used to discuss priorities for this year and prepare resources for the new spelling and reading teaching we will be doing. As you will know if you have a child in Year 2 to 5, we will be sending spellings home next week on Monday. These are to be done daily on the sheet and won't take more than a couple of minutes at a time. Because they relate to spelling patterns and rules, it will mean that they are more straightforward to learn and by knowing them, children will become more confident and fluent writers.

It was good to see attendance improve this week with 3 classes getting a certificate. There was quite a bit of illness around just before Christmas and I know a number of people were ill over the break. That being said, a quarter of the school (105 children) received 100% attendance certificates for last term, which I think is probably a record.

Clubs start next week and text messages should have gone out about which club your child has. Thank you to the office ladies and Miss Chambers for organising and for all the staff who are giving up their time for free to run a club. We have 29 clubs taking place this term which is amazing.

There are many events happening this term, some of which are listed in Diary Dates below. I had a good meeting with Pabulum our caterers on Tuesday following the parent survey they conducted. Having had roast dinner on Wednesday with some Year 2 children, I can tell you the food remains excellent. We have arranged provisional dates for after half term for some 'come dine with me' days. This is where parents will be able to come in and eat a school dinner with their children for a small cost. More details to follow.

TTRS Battle of the Bands

The Spring term brings back our annual TTRS 'Battle of the Bands' competition for classes from Year 3 to 6! Each week (beginning 13 January), your child's class will go head-to-head against another KS2 class, earning points by using our online times table platform, TTRS. At the end of the week, the winner will be announced and will earn 3 points, whilst the losing class earns one.

There have been a few tweaks to the game since last year which now means the maximum amount of time that can count to a class score is 45 minutes a day per pupil. The competition will also close at 08.00 every Friday. We expect it to be another closely fought competition. Just a reminder that TTRS is only available from 06.45 until 21.00 each day.

After seven weeks of battles, the top four teams will go into the TTRS semi-finals (1st versus 4th, 2nd versus 3rd). After the final, the winning team will earn themselves the exclusive TTRS trophy (to keep for the rest of the year) AND an extra 30-minute break time! The reigning champions are currently 6H - can any classes take them on and become our new TTRS Champions?
