Mrs Bowsher's Headteacher Comment:

It has been another busy week at Larchwood with lots going on as usual. Today we have had the children's author Jessica Betts Gray in sharing her books thanks to the excellent Chicken and Frog bookshop. Many of Year 1 and 2 now have a signed copy of their own. I have seen some great lessons taking place this week including design technology lessons. For example, Year 4 have been developing their understanding of levers as they experimented with different types ready for making moving Viking Longships and Year 2 have made recycled instruments.

As part of the same design technology curriculum, this week I had some cheesy pasta made by Year 6. You probably know that we cook every half term in all classes thanks to our large children's kitchen. Cooking half-termly is a unique experience that children get at Larchwood that they would not get at other schools and as pointed out by one of the Year 6 children, I get to have my meals made for me!

Yesterday evening we hosted the Discovery Educational Trust board meeting. Before it started, I gave a tour of the school to a number of the trustees and members. The Trust board oversee the decision making for all five trust schools and hold us all to account. By holding one of their meetings at each school they get a better understanding of what is happening to back up all the reports they get and decisions they make. Some of the members and trustees have a long-standing relationship with the school so it is always good to welcome them back. 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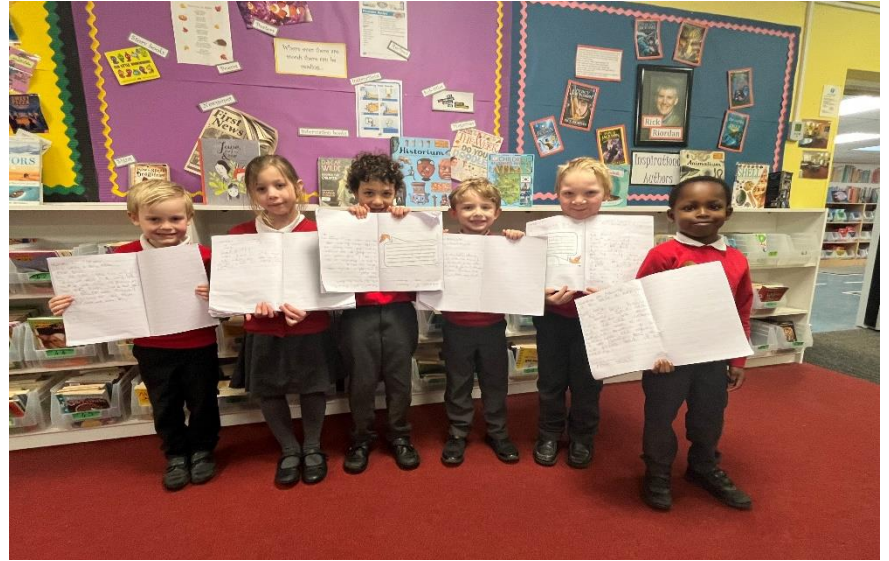
